## Cultural Funding by Government—2020—21

## Local government

The estimate of expenditure funded by Local government in 2020–21 for cultural activities was **\$1,785.8m**. This represented **23%** of the total government funded expenditure on cultural activities.

- Local government cultural expenditure dropped 3% (or \$54.7m) between 2019–20 and 2020–21.
- Expenditure on cultural activities generally reflected the size of the population (New South Wales—\$536.0m, Victoria—\$509.0m and Queensland—\$340.1m).

Total recurrent expenses dropped 5% (or \$76.7m) to \$1,482.2m.

Recurrent expenses accounted for 83% (\$1,482.2m) of funded cultural expenditure. New South Wales had the largest amount of recurrent expenditure at \$465.3m, followed by Victoria (\$385.5m) and Queensland (\$275.3m).



## Cultural and Creative Statistics Working Group

Total Local government capital expenditure was \$303.6m.

Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland spent the largest amounts of capital (\$123.5m, \$70.7m, and \$64.8m respectively).
