Cultural Funding by Government—2020—21

South Australian Government

The estimate of expenditure funded by the South Australian Government in 2020–21 for cultural activities was \$233.3m representing a decrease of 3% or \$6.0m from 2019–20. This amount includes \$14.2m COVID support funding for cultural and creative organisations and infrastructure, businesses, individuals, support programs and initiatives.


- Recurrent expenses accounted for 93% (\$217.0m) of funded cultural expenditure.
- Capital expenditure was \$16.4m, and the largest two categories were *Other museums and cultural heritage* (\$7.2m) and *Performing arts venues* (\$7.1m).
- The estimate of per person funding was \$131.78.

Funds on Total Heritage activities (recurrent and capital) rose 1% (or \$0.9m) to \$92.5m.

Expenditure on *Other museums and cultural heritage* increased by \$1.6m, offset by slight falls in *Art museums* (\downarrow \$0.5m), *Archives* (\downarrow \$0.2m), and *Libraries* (\downarrow \$0.1m).

The largest categories of *Heritage* expenditure were *Other museums and cultural heritage* with \$36.9m, followed by *Libraries* with \$36.4m.

Funds for Total Arts activities (recurrent and capital) remained steady (\uparrow \$0.6m) at \$140.8m.

The largest increases were in *Multi-arts festivals* (\uparrow \$7.4m) and *Theatre* (\uparrow \$4.0m), with decreases in *Performing arts venues* \downarrow \$14.6m (due to completion of capital works), and *Community arts and cultural development* \downarrow \$5.7m (due to reclassification of recurrent funding allocated to this category in 2019–20).




Figure 2. South Australian Government arts expenditure, by selected categories

Performing arts venues (\$40.8m), accounted for nearly one-third (29%) of all funded expenditure by the South Australian Government on *Arts* activities.

Other main categories of Arts activities funding were:

- Multi-arts festivals—\$19.4m
- Arts education—\$16.8m
- *Music*—\$12.1m
- *Cross-art form*—\$10.6m.

Total recurrent expenditure increased 5% (or \$10.6m) to \$217.0m.

The largest recurrent expenditure was for *Libraries*, \$35.9m, followed by *Performing arts venues* (\$33.7m) and *Other museums and cultural heritage* (\$29.8m).

The largest recurrent dollar increase was for the categories of *Multi-arts festivals*, \uparrow \$7.4m and *Performing arts venues* \uparrow \$7.2m, between 2019–20 and 2020–21.




Figure 3. South Australian Government recurrent cultural expenditure, by selected categories
