Local government


The estimate of expenditure funded by Local government in 2021–22 for cultural activities was **\$1,826.7m**. This represented **22%** of the total government funded expenditure on cultural activities.

- Local government cultural expenditure increased 2% (or \$40.9m) between 2020–21 and 2021–22.
- Expenditure on cultural activities generally reflected the size of the population (New South Wales—\$555.4m, Victoria—\$543.2m and Queensland—\$331.5m).


Total recurrent expenses increased 7% (or \$109.1m) to \$1,591.3m.

Recurrent expenses accounted for 87% (\$1,591.3m) of funded cultural expenditure. New South Wales had the largest amount of recurrent expenditure at \$483.9m, followed by Victoria (\$443.7m) and Queensland (\$303.5m).

Total Local government capital expenditure was \$235.4m.

Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland spent the largest amounts of capital (\$99.5m, \$71.4m, and \$27.9m respectively).


Figure 2. Local government cultural expenditure, recurrent and capital, by state and territory(a)(b)—2021—22
